# CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION

# A. Background of The Problems

Because aggression is so difficult to define, social psychologists, judges, and politicians (as well as many other people, including lawyers), have spent a great deal of time trying to determine what should and should not be considered aggression. Doing so forces us to make use of the processes of causal attribution to help us determine the reasons for the behavior of others because it involves the perception of intent, what looks like aggression from one point of view may not look that way from another, and the same harmful behavior may or may not be considered aggressive depending on its intent. Intentional harm is, however, perceived as worse than unintentional harm, even when the harms are identical

Mario F. Mendez defines apathy is an important brain-behavior disorder and a part of many neuropsychiatric behaviors and neurodegenerative disorders. Although originally defined as a lack of emotion, apathy is more precisely a disturbance of the motivation processes of the brain.

Crazy Rich Asians is a 2018 American romantic comedy film directed by Jon M. Chu, from a screenplay by Peter Chiarelli and Adele Lim, based on the 2013 novel of the same name by Kevin Kwan.

Her mere existence in the world of the Singapore Rich People creates drama. As a person, Rachel is well-educated, measured, career-driven, and beautiful. Despite her pretty elite education background, Rachel is totally unpretentious and down-to-earth. While many of the other female characters in the movie script are materialistic and only concerned with clambering up the social ladder. Rachel is uninterested and even bothered by the wealth. Eleanor think Rachel can not fit in her family because she is different in all aspects. That is why Eleanor try so hard to make Rachel disappear. Rachel who is basically love his boyfriend, Nick Young, never give up on her love because she thinks Nick's wealth can not compare her love to him. Eleanor against Rachel

by her aggression while Rachel against Eleanor with only herself and make Eleanor become an apathetic person. Rachel wake Eleanor up of what she has done when Rachel defeated her on Mah-jong game.

#### **B.** Identification of the Problems
