CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Research

Each society has some basic needs which have to be satisfied for better day to day life. Social institutions are a medium like as social molds which are established for carrying out basic functions and help to established collective image of behavior. These institutions come in to existence for satisfying needs of an individual. Even though, every institution carries out certain specific function. It is not entirely independent. The series focuses in her obsession with shopping and its resulting complications for her life. The most recent addition to the *Shopaholic* series, "Shopaholic to the Rescue" was released on 22 October 2015.

In the last *Shopaholic* series, Shopaholic to the Rescue tells about problem in her family. Where Becky's father and her best friend's husband disappear and now she was on a road trip to Las Vegas. She was determined to get to the bottom of why her dad has mysteriously disappeared that has everyone worried. Her dad refuses to tell his family what he was up to and Suze's husband, Tarkie, refuses to contact Suze at all. This problem made Becky knew that her family need help, Luke, Minnie, Suze, and her mother to look for them together. And this novel showed that Becky comes up her biggest, boldest, most brilliant plan yet.

I choose this novel because tells about a sense of concern for the family. Where is rarely we wanted to care with the family. This novel shows that as child we cannot life without parents. Parents have important role for family. Every family is different, but many families face similar issues. This study aims to analyze and show how Becky and her family face the problems.
