

CHAPTER 5

CONCLUSION

Based on the data analysis, I concludes the results and the significance of this research as described as follows. Firstly, I analyzed forty data from The King 2019 movie transcript that are classified according to John. R. Searle's theory of illocutionary acts. The first classification is representative, there are seven data consists of convincing, explaining, stating, agreeing, and informing. The second classification is declarative, there are four data consists of declaring, and deciding. The third classification is commissive, there are seven data consists of rejecting, threatening, and offering. The fourth classification is the directive, there are seventeen data consists of questioning, commanding, requesting, warning, and advising. The fifth classification is expressive, there are five data consists of thankful, express anger, express happiness and express dislike.

Secondly, some classifications of illocutionary act which occur in the conversations are averagely the same, so five classifications of illocutionary acts occur in this data analysis. However, the classification of directive illocutionary acts is more dominant in this study, because it is in accordance with the setting and situation in the film to support the actions of the main character.

Thirdly, the study of language could not be done without considering aspects of the speech situation. In this research, I analyzes the context as one aspect of the speech situations which is the significant thing in pragmatics study. The context is so influential to describe the situation where the illocutionary acts of utterances occur. I analyzes the context of the situation as background knowledge to assume the utterances shared by Hal as a speaker and his partner as a hearer.

After analyzing the data and concluding conclusions, I suggests that linguistics students who want to do research with a pragmatic approach can dig deeper into the theory of speech acts. Not only discussing illocutionary, but students can also discuss locutionary and perlocutionary. In addition, other researchers can observe other media or instructions not only films but also other media such as

newspapers, TV, radio which can also be the object of analysis of other pragmatic studies.

Based on this research, the writer hopes that there will be other researchers who will conduct research on the same topic to complete this research for the development of linguistics although in a different field. In addition, I hopes that this research can contribute to the reader's understanding of speech acts, and can be an additional reference for those who are interested in learning more about speech acts.
