CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION

The story begins when the Joker breaks up with the Harley Queen, and throws her to the streets. Luckily, Harley was helped by the owner of a Taiwanese restaurant and recovered from her relationship by cutting her hair, adopting a spotted hyena (which she named Bruce Wayne), and working at a roller derby night club.

One night, Harley gets drunk at nightclub which is belonging to Roman Sionis who is a mafia boss in Gotham city and beats Roman's driver after he insults her. She then escapes and meets Dinah Lance, a singer in Roman's night club who then saves Harley from a kidnapping and murder attempt by defeating the bad guys who is chasing on her. Roman is seeing the fight from far and being impressed by Dinah's skills, he appoints her as his new driver the day after the fight scene. Roman sends Dinah and his sadistic right-hand man, Victor Zsasz, on a mission to retrieve the diamond embedded in the account number of the Bertinelli the mafia family who was massacred several years ago.

Meanwhile elsewhere, GCPD Detective Renee Montoya investigates a series of mass murders by a vigilante arrows (the murderer is actually the daughter of the Bertinelli family (Helena Bertinelli) whose diamonds are being taken by Dinah) Montoya suspects Roman the mafia boss is the murderer of the mass murder, knowing that Dinah worked in Roman's bar she approached Dinah and ask her to be her informant.

The next day, after Zsasz pocketed the diamond. A little pickpocket Cassandra "Cass" Cain stole the diamond from Zsasz's pocket but swallowed it to hide the diamond after she was arrested and put in children prison where she met Montoya who had caught her often before. One day, Harley runs away from Montoya and several other people who have been abused in the past when she was with the joker, unfortunately she is caught by Roman's men who took her to Roman's residence.

When tortures Harley and prepares to kill her, Zsasz comes in hurry to tells Roman that Cassandra the little pickpocket who is now in prison has the diamond, hearing this, Dinah, who also knows Cassandra warns Montoya about the possibility of Cassandra being targeted by the mafia. Harley take the opportunity to run with offering herself to return the diamonds for him, so they can release her and Roman agrees. Roman made a competition for the criminals to kill Harley and find Cassandra to get the diamonds so that many criminals join this competition and hunt down Harley Quinn who by then had escape with Cassandra from Prison. Montoya and Dinah who worried about Cassandra who is only an abandoned girl, make them help Harley to protect Cassandra, assisted by Helena Bartinelli, who has purpose of taking her diamonds that still in Cassandra's stomach. They are ambushed by several thugs but managed to kill them all.

Relating to the fact above I am interest in studying Birds of Prey movie script to get deeper understanding about feminist movement and its relation to toxic masculinity, I choose online archive of some feminism theory which consists some experts that will be used to analyze the major character.
