CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background of The Research

Psychoanalytic criticism is a literary criticism which uses some of the techniques in psychoanalysis to the interpretation of literature. Peter Barry in his book says that psychoanalytic is a form of literary eriticism which uses of the techniques of psychoanalysis in the interpretation of literature" (Barry, 2009: 92). By using psychoanalytic criticism, it can be used to investigate disorders in people's personality, There are many disorders that can be found in psychology's lield, One of the disorders that the writer analyses in this study is eating disorder. The Lype of eating disorder in this study is Anorexia Nervosa.

Defense mechanism, in psychoanalytic theory, any of a group of mental processes that enables the mind to reach compromise solutions to conflicts that it is unable to resolve. The process is usually unconscious, and the compromise generally involves concealing from oneself internal drives or feelings that threaten to lower self-esteem or provoke anxiety. The concept derives from the psychoanalytic hypothesis that there are forces in the mind that oppose and battle against each other. The term was first used in Sigmund Freud's paper "The Neuro-Psychoses of Defence" (1894).

According to an article hy JR Bemporad, eating disorder has become an issue in the world. Historically, eating disorders were a medical rarity prior to. World War I, Then, after fashion magazines were introduced, the incidence of anorexia nervosa shot up. Anorexia nervosa itself is an cating disorder that makes people lose more weight than is considered healthy for their age and height (Bemporad, 1997). Person with this disorder may have an intense fear of weight gain, even when they are underweight. During the process of developing individual's personality, there are some factors that may cause individual's personality to be in disorder. However, some Tactors during the process of developing individual's personality can be the reason behind the eating disorder.

Anorexia itself is a mental disease, often caused by some sort of trauma, like family issues, mental abuse, sexual abuse or depression. This symptom often begins during the pre-teen or teen years or young adulthood. It is more common in females, but also may be seen in males. The disorder is seen mainly in white women who usually have a goal-oriented in family or personality (Coleman. 1964: 65). Thus, a movie entitled To The Bone by Martin Noxon represent the idea of Anorexia itself.

Ellen is a woman who has anorexia, has lost her appetite for food. Ellen often measures the circumference of her hand to make sure that the circumference of her hand does not exceed her grip. Ellen also never finished her meal, only a little of it was consumed and partially regurgitated. In addition, before going to bed, Ellen always does sit-ups to lose calories in her body. Ellen's body was showing bones every day.

Ellen droppeds out of school dealing with anorexia or something and returned to her stepmother and father's home after struggling through an inpatient program and failing to make progress. With her absent father who doesn't want to have anything to do with her, Ellen Susan's stepmother (Carrie Preston) meets an anorexia specialist, Dr. William Beckham (Keanu Reeves), Susan who insisted that Ellen should join Dr. William Beckham. Ellen was reluctant to do it at first, but her younger sister changed her mind.

This film is related to my term paper's title which is The Analysis of Defenses Mechanism from Anorexia Nervosa in Ellen "To The Bone" Movie. The story of this film portrayed Ellen as one of the main character who experiences suffering from Anorexia Nervosa which is an example of a woman who is too concerned about having an ideal body. And there is pressure from public opinion or views that make us think too much of the body so that it makes us depressed and always tries to have an ideal body. She will think about every calorie or every meal he will vomit later. The trauma of the ideal body is embedded in the psyche of both. This moves their body to refuse intake. This is what makes me interested in analyzing this film.

The reason why this film is important to be discussed as the object of the study because it reveals the psychological aspects Anorexia Nervosa disease who are too concerned about having an ideal body and conditions can impact a trauma and depression.

Therefore from the explanation above, it makes me considered that it is an interested things to be analyzed.

1.2. Identification of The Problem

Based on the background of the study above, I state that the problem begins Ellen who is too concerned about having an ideal body and is afraid of fat. There is pressure from public opinion or views that make us think too much of the body so that it makes us depressed and always tries to have an ideal body. But after that, he didn't realize that what he was doing was too much. When Ellen wants to eat, she will think about every calorie or every meal he will vomit later.

Furthermore, I identify that Ellen a big role in her trauma of the ideal body is embedded in the psyche of both that lead to emergence of their body to refuse intake.

1.3. Limitation of The Problem

Based on the identification of the problem above, I limit the problem of the research on analysing the theme of my thesis through intrinsic approach, such as characterization, plot and setting, as well as an extrinsic approach which are psychology of literature, the concept of Trauma and Rationalization as Defense Mechanism.

1.5. Objective of The Research

Based on the formulation of the problem above, the purpose of this research is to prove the existance of Rationalization as Defense Mechanism in Ellen movie To The Bone. To achieve this goal, the researcher did several research stages as follows:

- 1. To analyze the characterization used telling and showing can be used to study the character

- 3. To prove that defense mechanism impact can be used as a support in the psychology of literature.
- 4. To prove that my assumption about this film is the use of defense mechanisms on the main character.

1.6. Method of The Research

3. Technique of Analysis Data
