1.1 Background of the Problem

According to Kurnia Saputri (Saputri, 2016) script is written work by using display screen writers for a movie, video games, or television program. Scripts may be original works or version from existing piece of writing. In them the movements, expression, dialogues of the character are also narrated. A play for television as known as a teleplay. One of the literary works which have structural similarity with drama, it means that the script is a movie script also has a background, characterization, plot, and themes.

The movie script "All the Bright Places" is the one of the work famous author and screenwriter in the United States that is Jennifer Niven. Her works are not only in the novel, but are released through films, so that Jennifer Niven gets international best-selling American author in 2015. Liz Hannah also a part in writing the movie script "All the Bright Places". She is an American screenwriter and producer. She is best known for her work on Steven Spielberg's 2017 journalism, drama The Post for which she was nominated for a Golden Globe for Best Screenplay.

Similar to Violet Markey, Theodore Finch also lives in the shadow of trauma within him. He was depressed and often thought about ending his life. Finch feels more and more isolated, because no one in his family understands his condition. Violet Markey and Theodore Finch get to know when the two are paired up for a school assignment. At that time, the students were asked to write an essay about the amazing places in Bartlett, Indiana. Finch also invites Violet to a number of places that look strange and ordinary, but have a lot beauty behind them. They fall in love.

However, Finch's behaviour becomes more erratic. He sometimes disappears for days at a time without contacting anyone. One day, while he and Violet are swimming at the Blue Hole, he disappears under the water. By the time he resurfaces, Violet is distraught and pushes him to tell her more about himself, threatening to leave if he doesn't comply. He reveals that he had been physically

abused by his father as a child, and that his mother is absent in his life. On one occasion, Finch and Violet stay out all night by accident, upsetting Violet's parents.
