## CHAPTER 5 CONCLUSION

Regarding to the problem statement and the analysis in previous chapter in All the Bright Places movie script by Jennifer Niven using intrinsic approach and extrinsic approach through psychology, finally I am able to make the conclusion.

After analyzing the movie script, I conclude that intrinsic approach can be used to analyze All the Bright Places movie script. I implemented showing method to understand the characterization of a few in the movie script. The characters that I have analyzed are Theodore Finch as the main character.

Theodore Finch as the main character, he is impulsive and significant mood swings in manic episode, anxiety and dark moods in depressive episode, and also he is irritable, aggressive, and feelings of guilt based on the effect of bipolar disorder itself. The condition, the situation, place, time, and atmosphere in the bridge, school especially Mr. Embry's counseling room, Indiana, Blue Hole, Class, Violet's house and Finch's house are supports the kinds of the setting. The plot as well supports the characterization and setting in this movie script. The plot as well establish the chronology of an event because plot used to explain the events which has been made by the screenwriter, or the main part of the movie script.

I find out that bipolar disorder has two episodes that is manic episode and depressive episode. And also the effect of bipolar disorder consist of irritability, aggressiveness, and feelings of guilt.

I find out bipolar disorder of Theodore Finch experienced that is manic episode which is where Theodore Finch has an aggressive behavior, as well as being impulsive, which means he takes action without thinking, besides that, he also comes and goes as he pleases when he starts to feel out of control. He becomes active and productive because he does school project assignments and helps Violet deal with her trauma, then he also often does risky things. Furthermore, depressive episode which is where Theodore Finch can't control emotion, Experiences significant mood swings, and when he runs away to calm down himself sometimes it becomes self-destructive, feeling anxious and emptiness are appear, feels depressed and hopeless, and also he commits suicide. In the effect of bipolar disorder of Theodore Finch, irritability appears when he hears things that make him triggered, especially if people call him "freak". This is often makes him angry and as a result makes him aggressive. There are times when he will feel too happy, especially when he is with Violet because Finch loves Violet, so that sometimes he does things that are out of control and that makes him feelings of guilty for everything messed up.

I find out the theme of this movie script develop using the result of analysis intrinsic approach and extrinsic approach. In intrinsic approach be composed method of characterization showing method, plot, and setting. All of elements has elaboration to support the theme of the movie script. Showing method has shown to analyze Theodore Finch character.

Plot explain the structure and arrangements of events and action of Theodore Finch in the movie script. Setting represented the time and place of the movie script of Theodore Finch's action. In extrinsic through psychology of literature and the concept of bipolar disorder that is manic episode and depressive episode support the theme of the movie script. I use the effect of bipolar disorder that consist of irritability, aggressiveness, and feelings of guilty to analyze the main character of the movie script.

I hope the research can provide knowledge, especially about bipolar disorder and psychology of literature, and for those who are interested in deepening their knowledge to analyze the effect of bipolar disorder through the characterization of the character of the movie script.
