Based on the analysis of the intrinsic and extrinsic elements in the script for this film, the writer concludes several things. The main character is Mary, a girl who is confident in her abilities and is responsible for fulfilling the five hierarchy of needs with persistence, hard work, and the presence of supporting characters who help her. Mary has no problem meeting biological needs, security needs, belongingness, affection, esteem needs, self-actualization needs.

The characterization analysis based on shows the method that has been carried out in the analysis above to find Mary can fulfill the hierarchy of needs that she gets from other characters. These other figures participate in helping Mary's hierarchy of needs. In this research, plot and setting can build a theme to build a film script. Therefore, the intrinsic and extrinsic elements are analyzed, so the theme obtained in this film script is Ambitious Become Happiness. Where at the beginning of the story, the characters have their own ambitions, thus making self-actualization difficult to obtain. However, at the end of the story the characters in this film lower their ambitions and they manage to fulfill the hierarchy of needs based on Maslow's theory, especially for the character of Mary.

This research is expected to be useful for further research and can be a reference for researchers who want to examine the hierarchy of needs according to Maslow's theory.
