CONCLUSION

The conclusion are presented in accordance with the result of the data of analysis in the previous chapter. The intrinsic approach which consist of characterization by using showing method, plot and setting. Elaborated with analysis through extrinsic approach by using the theory of Sociological Criticism through the race, racism, racial injustice.

Based on the result of the analysis in the previous chapter, I can conclude that many of these concerns are evident in miniseries When They See Us which begins with the arbitrary arrest of the five teenage boys who are aggressively questioned by police officers without their parents present for hours on end without food or a toilet break. Physical and oral abuse is heaped on the five leaving them disoriented, frightened and vulnerable to the demands of the police. Those are such is the level of police aggression.

After I analyze about racial injustice in this miniseries, I know that racial injustice in this miniseries happen because people of color are often ill-equipped to deal with the criminal justice system, from lack of knowledge about the law, to lack of access to legal representation — and, in the case of Latin and other groups, a lack of facility with the English language.

What followed has become a national scandal; a miscarriage of justice that revealed the New York Police Department and District Attorney's Office to be guilty of racial profiling and a fundamental disregard for legal and human rights. The *When They See Us* true story confirms that from early on in the trial, the defense argued that Antron McCray, Kevin Richardson, Raymond Santana and Korey Wise has been coerced or tricked into confessing.

The moral values of this research is people really should also realize the notion that, to some extent, their linguistic habit has sharpened the stigma of racial stereotype and prejudice upon a certain race.

According to this research, it is potential for the next research to analyze miniseries When They See Us from part one to four through other approaches or concepts. This research also can introduce the student of the English Language and Culture Department about racial injustice in literary work. This research also can use as a comparison to write a better analysis.
