Unfortunately, Katherine, Dorothy, Mary, and other black women who worked at NASA were often discriminated against. For example, the women had to work in a separate building from the white women and were only allowed to use the black toilets and canteen. These women are also often belittled for their work at NASA, by both black (DuRocher, 2011) men themselves and men in general.
