CONCLUSION

After analyzing the guilt and anxiety experienced by the character Rose in the novel K.L. Slater entitled *The Mistake*, the researcher can conclude that the analysis of the intrinsic and extrinsic elements contained in this novel strongly supports the portrayal of the character Rose, who's her presence influences the story. Her naive and careless nature then paved the way for Gareth's character to enter her world. In the end, it is known that Gareth began to control the character Rose which in the end caused guilt and anxiety in her. It influences her relationship with her family and her best friend, Cassie.

The title *The Mistake* describes the theme that is carried out from the novel: mistakes in choosing something that cause guilt and anxiety because of have been done in the past. In this novel, it is told that Rose falls in love with a man named Gareth, who has a ten-year age difference with her.
