1.1. Background of the Problem

In this era script is an important ingredient in filmmaking because script established what's going to happen. Even so, in ancient times scripts were not very important. According to Price (2013, p. 6) from 1896 to 1907, a script was not necessary, other than perhaps as an aide-mémoire or memo to self.

The script is the most important part of the film This can be seen from the theory Haigh & Hutchinson. movie script is, of course, the document that specifies the sequence of events, cinematography techniques, and dialogue to be depicted in a non-interactive movie (Haigh & Hutchinson, 2009, p. 18). Inside the script consists of the dialogue that must be spoken by the cast. Even though not all the dialogue in the script follows grammatical rules. This can be found in some movie script one of the example from movie script *Bad Boys for Life*.

Bad Boys for Life is a film about two detectives investigating related to Mike's past as the main character in this film. There are many speeches that have mistake contained in this script and I am interested in analysing the grammar mistakes. The mistakes occurred in the words of Mike, Marcus and other characters. I chose this film because the language used in this film tends to be modern and often used by young people.

1.2. Identification of the Problem

Grammatical mistakes that appear in movie's script can have potential "danger". Danger here means grammatical mistakes will have an effect for English language learners and non English native speaker will use english. This is because grammatical mistakes are often found in movie's script in this day and age. It can cause the learners and those non native speakers to get used to using sentence that contains mistkes and be considered to be correct. If this continues to happen, people will normalize the mistake and they cannot learn English in a proper way.

1.3. Limitation of the Problem

Due to the limitations of research, I limit several things so that this term paper does not deviate. I only focus on my research on the mistakes in the sentences or utterances uttered by Mike and Marcus as the main characters in the movie. - 3. What are the grammatical mistakes found in other characters utterances based on the movie's script of the *Bad Boys for Life*?

1. The grammatical mistakes that found in the movie's script of the *Bad Boys for Live* spoken by Mike

- 2. The grammatical mistakes that found in the movie's script of the *Bad Boys for Live* spoken by Marcus
- 3. The grammatical mistakes that found in the movie's script of the *Bad Boys for Live* spoken by other characters as supporting actor
