CHAPTER 5 CONCLUSION

Based on the findings and research above, the researcher concludes that there are three types of genetic structuralism proposed by Lucien Goldmann. Goldmann in his theory divides genetic structuralism into three, namely human facts, collective subjects, and world views. As seen in the chapter above, the researcher examines two of the three, namely human facts and collective subjects. In addition, the researcher also examined the case that occurred in the Green Book movie script, which is racism.

The racism that occurs in every place in different regions of America is also different. The most suspenseful racism that has ever happened was in Mississippi, as the characters had to deal with pretty tough problems. The regulations on discriminatory segregation in the region are also quite strict. If we look, Don, the character in the Green Book movie script never commits acts of violence. However, Don has always been subjected to racism problem related to physical violence. In addition, Don also received discrimination treatment from white people which even though Don's presence did not bother them at all.

We can also conclude that Don is trying to assimilate himself. While assimilating himself, he received racism from white people. Also, we can tell that white people have more privilege than black people. Privilege is an advantage. Whenever Don gets into racism problems, Tony is always there to help Don. Also, when Don called the governor to release him from his cell, he was the white man who helped Don free. At that time, the way to solve the problem of racism was, people who had privilege had to use it well and for good. In addition, the way to overcome the problem of racism from black people is that they have to be brave. Just like when Don dares to go out to a bar alone at night. Because they should be able to be free, freely travel anywhere without feeling threatened, without having to feel discriminated, to feel accepted, etc. There is no difference between blacks and whites, we are all human after all. From the research above, we can see that social class was very influential at that time in the 1960s. We can also see that black people there are considered to be inferior to white people. It is evident from the number of slaves who are black people, the unequal social treatment between blacks and whites, etc. We can see that Don tries to blend in with his surroundings, like when he is going to bars at night alone, etc. But as the consequence he received racist violence such as physical violence and threats. All the social activities that Don do are his efforts to fight for black social equality. So, as you can see, social class is very much considered by many people during that time, also we can see that the African-American were fighting for their social equality.

From the analysis above, we can see that social conditions in real life and social conditions in the Green Book movie script are interconnected. The racism faced by African-American characters in the Green Book movie script, Don Shirley, is the same as the racism case that happened to George Floyd. The story of an African-American, George Floyd, was quite famous in 2020. He was physically abused and arrested by the Minneapolis, Minnesota police until he died. They both received physical violence, and intimidation from other races. This proves that a literary work can be affected by the social conditions in real life and they are related.
