

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Problem

Literature and psychology have a close relationship. In fact, their relationship can't be separated. Literary work is the result of a psychological condition of the author (Endraswara 2003: 96). Besides that, the figures which are depicted the authors in literature, rarely as the real portrayed of their environment at that time. The fictional characters in literature usually display a variety of personality and behavior associated with psychiatric and psychological experiences or conflicts as experienced by humans in real life. Literature and psychology tend to have the same deal with the problems of human beings as individuals and social. They utilize human experiences as object study. Some people think that literature is a part of author's imagination as outlined in the form of words thus forming a work. Authors' imagination occurs when they are in their subconscious condition that occurs when they are dreaming. Endraswara said that literature is the creation of mental process and thinking that the authors' create in their subconscious condition then they pour out it to their conscious condition (Endraswara 2003: 96). In this research I will bring Paul Salkovskis obsession theory.

In Salkovskis theory, obsession is intrusive, repetitive thoughts, images or that are unacceptable and unwanted and give rise to subjective resistance (Rachman and Hodgson., 1980, p. 10). The necessary and sufficient conditions for determining whether a thoughts, image or impulse is obsessional are (a) high degree of intrusiveness, (b) internal attribution, (c) unwantedness, and (d) difficulty of control (Rachman and Hodgson, 1980). According to Salkovskis, two cognitive processes are the critical factors that turn an intrusive thoughts into an obsession. The first process involves the appraisal of the intrusive thoughts. If the intrusion is appraised as involving personal responsibility for causing possible harm to self or others, then the mental event will be experienced as both discomforting and unacceptable. Obsession prone person are predisposed to evaluate certain intrusive thoughts, image, or impulses in this manner because of their underlying dysfunctional beliefs

of overresponsibility and harm (Salkovkis P. , Obsessional Compulsive Problem: a cognitivw behavioural analysis, 1985)

For doing this research, Ingrid Thorburn is a lonely and mentally ill woman who lives in Pennsylvania and is obsessed with social media. Ingrid becomes obsessed with people she thinks have more desirable lives than her. After a famous social media influencer named Taylor Sloane replies to Ingrid's comment on her picture, Ingrid decides to move to Los Angeles and try to be her good friend (using a \$60,000 inheritance her mother left her). Ingrid can impress Taylor, and her husband Ezra, through lying and developing a relationship with them. Things become creepy when the couple realizes how obsessed Ingrid is with Taylor and her ideal dream life.

I chose the movie script *Ingrid Goes West* because this movie script is related to my term paper's Title, which is An Analysis of Obsessive Disorder on the Main Character In *Ingrid Goes West* Movie Script. Ingrid's character is very interesting to me. Ingrid, in this movie, is described as needy and lonely. I think her character may reflect someone with a mild personality disorder. Her obsession with the phone makes Ingrid an obsession like a psychopath. Ingrid needs a friend. And this movie shows how social media can influence everyone to become an obsession like Ingrid. The first is about through intrinsic approach such as characterization, setting, and plot. The second is about through extrinsic approach which is the psychology of literature Paul Salkovskis obsessive concept in *Ingrid Goes West* movie script.
