## INTRODUTION

## 1.1 Background of the Problem

Humans known as social creatures is because human beings cannot and do not live in isolation. As social beings, human always communicates with other human beings. In linguistics, a speech act is an utterance defined in terms of a speaker's intention and the effect it has on a listener. Yule (1996: 47) states that speech acts is action which is performed via utterances.

According to IMDb (2019)," How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World" explains about how the Vikings continue to rescue captured dragons and their efforts have resulted in the island becoming overpopulated with dragons. In a

response to the overcrowd, Hiccup desires to find the "Hidden World", a safe haven for dragons. Meanwhile Toothless finds his perfect date and that is the Light Fury who is held captive by warlords and she is given to infamous dragon hunter named Grimmel the Grisly (Night Fury Killer) as bait for him to capture Toothless himself and kill him since Toothless is the alpha of the dragons. However, the Light Fury falls in love with Toothless (The Night Fury) and teaches him the way to use his power and how to be able to beat Grimmel. Everyone celebrates their victory until Hiccup realizes it is time to let Toothless and all the dragons go. He bids his best friend farewell, and the two embraces tearfully. The dragons fly toward the hidden world and people now believe that the dragons are gone for good and Hiccup believes that no one can hurt the dragons anymore. Based on the explanation above, I can see the connection between how the characters use of language and the movie script. The language is used in the movie script contains unclear meanings so that context and function can have different meanings.

#### 1.2. **Identification of the Problem**

Based on the background of the problem above, I can identify that sometimes the characters in "How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World" can have misunderstandings occur in a conversation which is caused by a different interpretation of speech act between the speaker and the listener. In the movie script, Hiccup as the speaker often gives utterances that cannot be directly understood and that leads the other characters as the listener gives different responses to what Hiccup wishes.

#### 1.3. Limitation of the Problem

Based on the identification of the problem above, I limit my research to the classification and function of illocutionary and perlocutionary acts based on "How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World" movie script.
