1.1 Background of the Problem

Yule and Brown (1996) mention that pragmatic concern with study of meaning as it is communicated by speaker or writer and interpreted by listener or reader in an exact way.

Speech act theory is a subfield of pragmatics. This area of study is concerned with the ways in which words can be used not only to present information but also to carry out actions. Speech-act theory was introduced in 1975 by Oxford philosopher J.L. Austin in "How to Do Things With Words" and further developed by American philosopher J.R. Searle. It considers three levels or components of utterances: locutionary acts (the making of a meaningful statement, saying something that a hearer understands), illocutionary acts (saying something with a purpose, such as to inform), and perlocutionary acts (saying something that causes someone to act). Illocutionary speech acts can also be broken down into different families, grouped together by their intent of usage. This study was conducted to find out types of illocutionary acts on movie. Besides, this study also analyzes the contexts occurring in some conversations. The data used in this study were taken from the movie 1917.

First World War film 1917 has won three awards at 2019 Oscars. Based on his grandfather's wartime stories from a different period in history, Director Sir Sam Mendes' '1917 won seven prizes at the BAFTAS, and two awards at the Golden Globes. This movie is interested to be discussed, because in this movie had conversation that contains illocutionary acts that reflected in our daily life.

From this movie script can be found many illocutionary acts in the conversation or utterances of the main characters which represent our daily conversation. For example when General Enrinmore give an envelope to Blake and Schofield, "deliver this to Colonel Mckenzy. It is a direct order to call off tomorrow morning's attack" it is type of directive illocutionary acts, because speaker wants listener to do something for him. And also it show you how the listener react toward the order, they realize that seemingly impossible order. In a race against time, they must cross over into enemy territory to deliver a message that could potentially save 1,600 of their fellow comrades including Blake's own brother. in speech acts it called perlocutionary acts.

1.2 Identification of the Problem

Based on the background of the problem above, I identify the problem which arises in this movie is how the utterances influence people decision and braveness to do something even that is something really hard to do. And also it will show you how powerful directive illocutionary in military.
