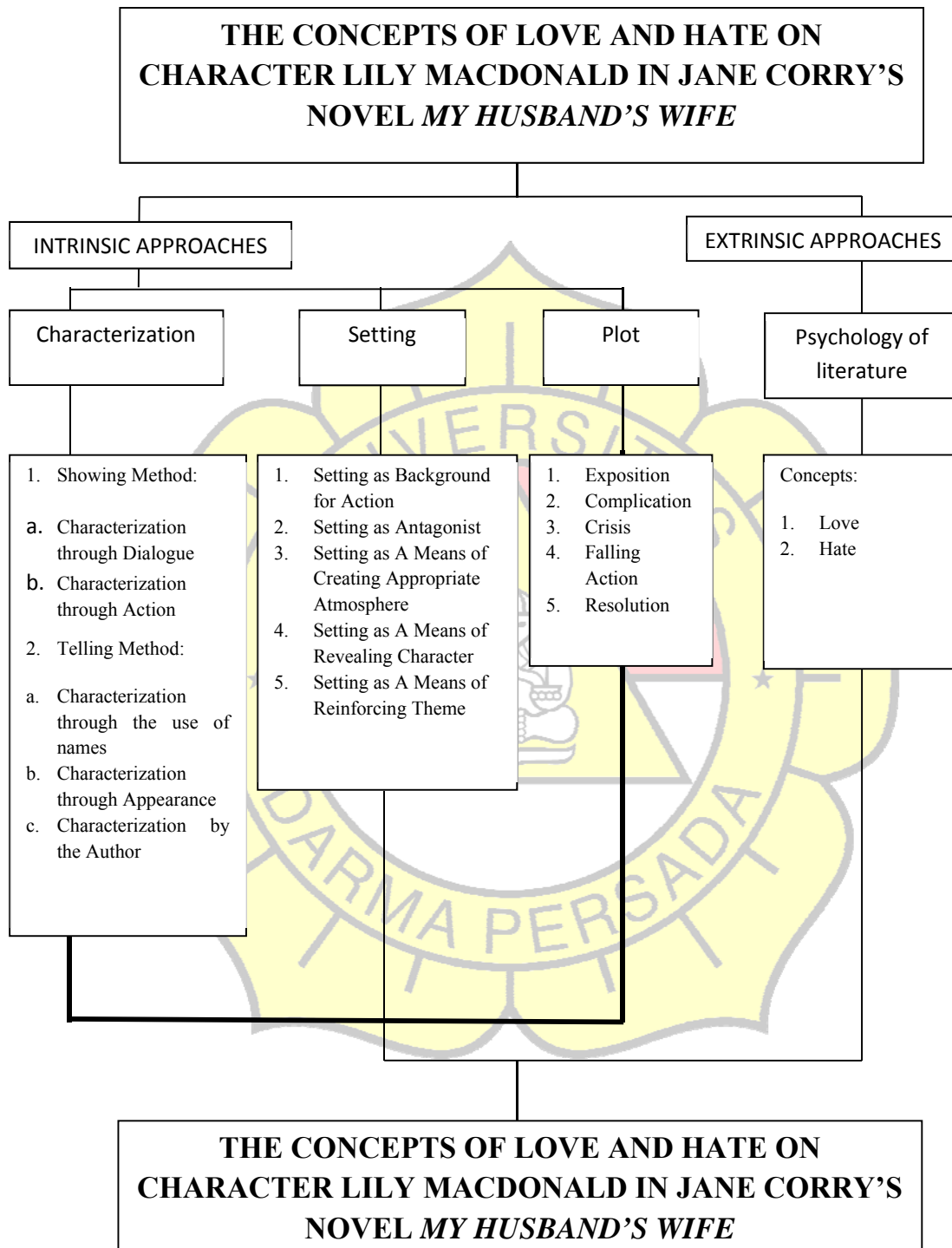

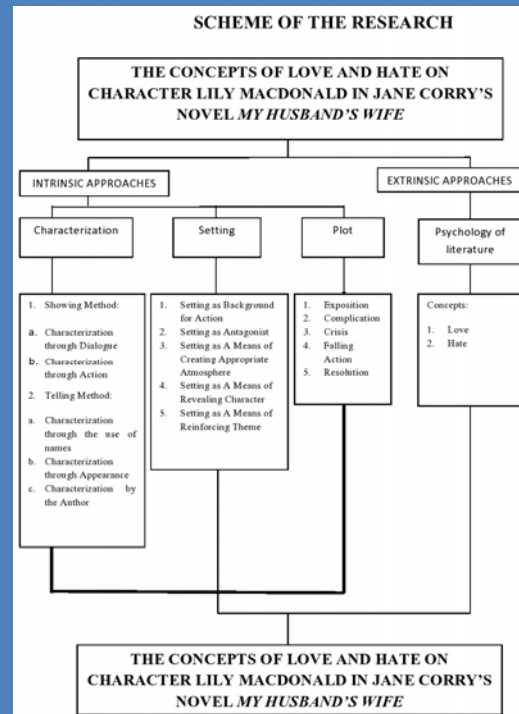
METHODS OF THE RESEARCH
