INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Problem

So that children can adapt and even control their emotions and are able to choose what they think is good & right • not good, this ability gradually goes through a process of development in children at an early age (Nurjannah 2017). Social development affects the growth and development process of a child and affects the emotional level of a child, this makes me analyze the character in "Inside Out" named riley in a film script that I analysed. The movie script was written by Pete Docter, Meg LeFauve and Josh Cooley, while the movie story was written by Pete Docter and Ronnie del Carmen based on Pete Docter's experiences with the behavioural changes of his 11 year old daughter, Ellie. The story of this movie script is very natural and happens to children in the real world. The script of this movie tells about what is in the head of an 11 year old girl, Riley. "Inside Out" runs in two continuous "worlds". In the real world, a girl named Riley grew up as a cheerful person in a small town in the state of Minnesota. His happy life suddenly had to change when his parents decided to move to San Francisco, California, a big city with different people and habits. Teenage Riley clearly has a hard time adjusting, as what she enjoyed in her old home is completely missing in her new home.

Meanwhile, in Riley's mind, there are five kinds of emotional manifestations that determine what happens to Riley's personality. They are Joy, Sadness, Fear, Anger, and Disgust. The interaction between these five emotions that shapes Riley's personality, is responsible for important memories in Riley's life in the form of a shining orb, and allows Riley to deal with anything well. Riley's feelings were dominated by Excitement, joy. The dominating memory of fun is enough to form a core memory that ultimately forms Riley's personality, which is called the Island of Personality. When he was a child, Riley was very carefree. However, things were not the same again when Riley entered her early teens, where Riley, who came from the suburbs, had to move to the California metropolis, San Francisco, to follow her father. Headquarters goes awry as Riley tries to adapt to big city life. While Joy tries to remain optimistic, that Riley can adapt to her new environment with great joy, these five emotions clash over how best to deal with Riley. life in a new city, home, school and neighbourhood. At that time, Riley, who had to adapt to a new environment, had to get an additional burden from her mother, who asked her to look happy in front of her father because she was going through difficult times. This made Riley's emotions spiral out of control. Joy fails to

control Riley's feelings. Riley even went through a depressive phase. I also adapted the script for the film "Inside Out" by applying Erikson's theory.

Erikson's Psychosocial Theory A theory of personality developed in several stages spanning the life span by developing learning about identity, and by developing methods that go beyond structured psychosocial settings. Erikson developed a theory of psychosocial development, namely how individual (psycho) needs of a person are integrated with the needs and demands of society (social). Erikson proposed 8 stages that we must go through in our development process. But to use these 8 stages, I don't think it's possible for me to take all of them because we can see that in the script inside out, the main characters are depicted from babies to 11 years old, so I didn't do that. t uses up to 8 stages, I only use up to 1 stage, namely Industry and Inferiority and I will explain this stage at the beginning of the theory. At each of these stages there are conflicts that must be faced and resolved so that we have normal development.

1.2 Identification of the Problem

Based on the background of the problem, I identified the problem of this research, namely starting from early childhood development to adolescents who have emotional levels that tend to be unstable in behaviour. as we know in the film script "Inside Out" we can see the problems faced by an 11-yearold boy named Riley who has to force his self to be happy in front of his parents during the moving process. but over time she could not stand this situation which ended in his becoming a child who denied the words of his parents, lied, stole, and thought he wanted to run away from home, even Riley became out of control over his emotions which made Riley a person of industry and inferiority.
