CONCLUSION

Based on the analysis of Illocutionary speech acts in Chapter 4, There are many types of Illocutionary act that are shown in the dialogue of "Hellboy" movie script. **Table 5.1. Frequency of Illocutionary Speech Acts**

After analyzing Hellboy and Alice's utterance, I have concluded that in total there are 55 identified data as Illocutionary speech acts, and they are divided into five categories.

First the most common types of Illocutionary speech act that are shown is Representative speech act. There are 30 utterances that contained the representative speech acts. These data are identified as such because the utterances conveyed facts or what the speaker considers as fact. Secondly, there are 19 utterances that contained the directive speech acts. These data are identified as such because the utterances contain elements such as request, order, etc. Thirdly, there are 4 utterances that contained the commissive speech acts. These data are identified as such because the utterance commits the speaker into a future action. And lastly, the least common type of speech acts that are shown in the movie script are declarative and expressive with only one utterance that contained declarative utterance and another utterance that contained expressive speech acts. These data are identified as such because the one of the utterance affect the state of the world, and the other utterance expressed the speaker's emotion and feelings.

After this research is finished, I would recommend other potential researchers who are interested in researching the subject of Speech Acts, especially in the field of Illocutionary acts to analyze the many categories of Illocutionary Speech Acts using certain source of data. These sources can be taken from many written documents such as, journals, movie script, novels, etc. And I also would recommend the readers, especially students learning the English language, to study the field of speech acts. Being able to understand Speech acts is important, because it allows us to understand the intention and function of an utterance.
