CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background of the Problem

Literature is a term that refers to a type of human expression. Human expression may be found in words formed and written into works referred to as poetry, prose, theatre, fiction, and nonfiction. Lizbeth Goodman states "Literature may be described as a collection of creative texts. It contains poetry, prose fiction, and theatre ". (Goodman 1996: 7.) This is followed up by Dr. Totawad Nagnath Ramrao, who remarked, "Literature is any written expression, whether it is lyrical, dramatic, or fictional. Literature constantly conveys human experience and employs narrative elements ". Ramrao (2016), p. 150. This indicates that works of literature are not limited to a single work but encompass a variety of works that aid in interpreting the worth of the literary work itself. Movie is one of the mediums that literature may employ nowadays. Many literary works nowadays employ cinema as a medium to present literary works that are not commonly recognized by everyone. Many academic works have been adapted into movies, and so have novels, historical dramas, theater, and poetry. The film adaptation is one of the literary works that we are familiar with today.

Feminism is a concept of thought that demands the discovery of equal rights and justice for women and men. "Feminism" was originally a French word. It referred to what in the 19thcentury United States was called "the woman movement": a diverse collection of groups all aimed, in one way or another, at "advancing" the position of women. Now, "feminism" is commonly used to refer to all those who seek, no matter on what grounds, to end women's subordination. (Jaggar, 1983:5). In our country, there are still many people who think that marrying a rich man for a woman can help the family economy, so that women do not need to achieve higher education and also do not need to work. This phenomenon is interesting to analyze because the message in this movie is really important and very inspiring for women.

This movie script tells the story of the lives of four girls from the March family, namely Meg, Jo, Amy, and Beth in the 1860s. The second child, Jo March, who is also the main character in this movie script, has a big dream to become a writer.
