BAB II

ANALISIS PERISTIWA-PERISTIWA YANG DIALAMI PARA TOKOH MELALUI PERWATAKAN TOKOH, LATAR DAN MOTIVASI

Pada bab ini, penulis akan menganalisis perwatakan para tokoh yang meliputi dialog antar tokoh dan tingkah laku tokoh, menganalisis latar yang meliputi latar fisik, sosial, dan spiritual, serta menganalisis motivasi.

D. Rangkuman

Dalam analisis pada bab II ini, penulis menganalisis unsur-unsur intrinsik karya sastra. Dalam hal ini penulis menganalisis perwatakan tokoh, latar, dan motivasi. Penulis mengambil enam tokoh yaitu Emily Webb, George Gibbs, Ibu Gibbs, Dokter Gibbs, Ibu Webb dan Bapak Webb untuk dianalisis masing-masing perwatakan dari tokoh tersebut. Perwatakan ini mencakup dialog antar tokoh dan tingkah laku tokoh.

Penulis menganalisis latar dalam drama ini yaitu latar fisik, sosial, dan spiritual. Latar yang terdapat di dalam drama ini yaitu berada di Grover's Corners, New Hampshire, yang masyarakatnya sangat beragama, senang bekerja dan berkebun, suka menolong. Dalam analisis motivasi, penulis menggunakan motivasi dari Christopher R. Reaske, dan tujuh motivasi, penulis hanya menggunakan tiga yaitu,
