# CHAPTER I

## INTRODUCTION

# A. Background of The Problem

"Happiness is not something ready made. It comes from your own actions."-Dalai Lama<sup>1</sup>. Life is just a common life if we do nothing inside it. on the other hand, life become beautiful if we do something; something good, memorable, and unforgetable. We just have one time live in this planet, so which one do you prefer to choose? make it ordinary or make it beautiful.

"If one dream should fall and break into a thousand pieces, never be afraid to pick one of those pieces up and begin again." - Flavia Weedn<sup>2</sup>. Dream and life are like a pair to get anything. Life without dream is just like walking without path so that dream, if we never realize our dream, we will never get what the real meaning of life is.

In the *Pursuit of Happyness*, Chris Gardner (Will Smith) is a bright and talented but marginally employed salesman. Struggling to make ends meet, Gardner finds himself and his five-year-old son evicted from their San Francisco apartment with nowhere to go. When Gardner lands an internship at a prestigious stock brokerage firm, he and his son endures many hardships, including living in shelters, in pursuit of his dream of a better life for the two of them. Chris Gardner (Will Smith) is a family man struggling to make ends meet. Despite his valiant attempts to help keep the family afloat, the mother (Thandie Newton) of his five-year-old son Christopher (Jaden Christopher Syre Smith) is buckling under the constant strain of financial pressure. No longer able to cope, she reluctantly decides to leave.

Chris, now a single father, continues doggedly to pursue a better-paying job using every sales skill he knows. He lands an internship at a prestigious stock

Despite his troubles, Chris continues to honor his commitment as a loving and caring father, using the affection and trust his son has placed on him as an encouragement to facehis obstacles.

#### B. Identification of The Problem

Based on the background above, I identify that thismovie is about a father who has many problems that insistents in his life. Failed in his marriage, left by his wife and being homeless are his problems in this film. However, he has a son who is very patient withhim. Christopher is a little angle in his life. Chris Gardner can't reach his dream without Christopher. So that, Iassume that the theme of this film is the reflection of the American Dream and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs that become a great passion in his failure of marriage.

#### C. Limitation of The Problem

Based on the identification of the problem above, I limit this research to the problems which happens in this family but in other handit is a factor in his successful life. To analyze this film, I use intrinsic elements such as: Showing Methods; What The Speaker Said, Motivation and Behavior of The Figure. I also use extrinsic elements such as sociology approaches; The American Dream and psychology approaches; Maslow's Needs Hierarchy.

# D. Formulation of The Problem

Based on the limitation problem above, I formulate the problem: Is my assumption true that the theme of this movie is the reflection of the American Dream and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs that become a great passion in a failure of marriage. In order to answer this question, I formulate the following problems:

- 1. Can Showing Methods such as What The Speaker Said, Motivation and Behavior of The Figure be used to analyze Chris Gardner's characterization?
- 2. Can the concept of setting and plot be used to analyze this film?
- Can Showing Methods such as Behavior of The Figure and Motivation show the existence of Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs and American Dream concept

#### E. The Purpose of The Research

Based on the formulation problem above, the purpose of this research is to prove my assumption in *Pursuit of Happyness* film, the reflection of the American Dream and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs that become a great passion in a failure of marriage. In brief, I take some steps as follows:

- 1. Analyzing the characterization by using Showing Methods.
- 2. Analyzing the setting and plot.
- Reinforcing the theme by using American Dream and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs concepts.

#### F. Framework of The Theories

Based on the purpose of the research above, In this research, I use intrinsic elements such as: Showing Methods; What The Speaker Said, Motivation and Behavior of The Figure. I also use extrinsic elements such as sociology approaches; The American Dream andpsychology approaches; Maslow's Needs Hierarchy

#### 1. Showing Methods

#### a. What The Speaker Said

Unlike the direct methods of characterization already discussed, showing involve the gradual rather than the immediate establishment of character. Such a process requires rather than exludes the active participation of the reader and in so

doing calls upon what Foster called "intelligence and memory." First, the reader should pay attention to the substance of the dialogue. Is it the important dialogue so it can develop the actions of the plot? If the speaker insists on talking only about himself or only on a single subject, we may conclude that we have either an agotist or a bore.

#### Motivation

In either case to understand the characterization of the character whether it is conscious or unconscious, it is necessary to identify the common pattern of conduct and behavior of the character.

In generally, motivation relates to the underlying encouragement of human nature as follows: love, hungry, greedy and etc.<sup>4</sup>

## c. Behavior of The Figure

In order to build the character by the behavior, it is important for the reader to observe in detail for every events in plot. It is also reflects to the characterization of the figure, the emotion, and the psychology which unconscious followed with the value which shown.<sup>5</sup>

#### 2. Setting

Setting in fiction is called on to perform a number of desired functions. It may serve five elements.<sup>6</sup>

#### a. Setting as background for action

When we speak of setting as background, then, we have in mind a kind of setting that exists by and large for its own sake, withou any clear relationship to action or characters, or at best relationship that is only tangential and slight. To see whether setting acts as an essential element in the fiction, or whether it exists merely as decorative and functionless background, we need ask ourselves this:

Could the work in question be set in another time and another place without doing it essential damage? If the answer is yes, then the setting can be said to exist as decorative background whose function is largely irrelevant to the purpose of the work as whole.<sup>7</sup>

#### b. Setting as antagonist

Setting in the form of nature can function as a kind of casual agent or antagonist, helping to establish plot conflict and determine the outcome of events.<sup>8</sup>

# c. Setting as a means of creating appropriate atmosphere

Many authors manipulate their settings as a means of arousing the reader's expectations and establishing an appropriate state of mind for events to come.<sup>9</sup>

# d. Setting as a means of revealing character

An author can also use the setting to clarify and reveal character by deliberately making setting a metaphoric or symbolic extension of character. <sup>10</sup>

# e. Setting as a means of reinforcing theme

Setting can also be used as a means of reinforcing and clarifying the theme of a novel or short story.<sup>11</sup>

# 3. Plot

Plot defined as the deliberately arranged sequence of interrelated events that constitute the basic narrative structure of a novel or a short story. Events of any kind, of course, inevitably involve people, and for this reason it is virtually impossible to discuss plot in isolation from character.<sup>12</sup>

#### a. Exposition

The exposition is the beginning section in which the author provides the necessary background information, sets the scene, establishes the situation, and

dates the action. It may also introduce the characters and the conflict, or the potential for conflict. The exposition may be accomplished in a single sentence or paragraph, or, in the case of some novels, occupy an entire chapter or more. 13

# b. Complication

Sometimes referred to as the *rising action*, breaks the existing equilibrium and introduces the characters and the underlying or inciting conflict. The conflict is then developed gradually and intensified.<sup>14</sup>

#### c. Crisis

The crisis, also referred to as the *climax*, is the moment at which the plot reaches its point of greatest emotional intensity; it is the turning point of the plot, directly precipitating its resolution.<sup>15</sup>

# d. Falling Action

Once the crisis, or turning point, has been reached, the tension subsides and the plot moves toward its appointed conclusion.<sup>16</sup>

#### e. Resolution

The final section of the plot is its resolution; it records the outcome of the conflict and establishes some new equilibrium or stability. The resolution is also referred to as the *conclusion*.<sup>17</sup>

#### 4. American Dream

Albertine Minderopin her book, Pragmatisme – Sikap Hidup dan Prinsip Politik Luar Negeri Amerikasaid: Tahun 1920-an Gilbert K. Chesterton setelah berkunjung ke Amerika, menyimpulkan bahwa bangsa Amerika adalah satusatunya bangsa di dunia yang terbentuk berdasarkan suatu sistem. According to the Maslow, the important thing is someone should pass the fundamental need before he achieves the next needs.)
