CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of The Problem

John Michael Crichton¹ was an American best-selling author, producer, director, and screenwriter, best known for his work in the science fiction, medical fiction, and thriller genres. His books have sold over 200 million copies worldwide, and many have been adapted into films. In 1994 Crichton became the only creative artist ever to have works simultaneously charting at No. 1 in television, film, and book sales (with *ER*, *Jurassic Park*, and *Disclosure*, respectively).

This film tells about John Hammond who creates a theme park on a tropical island near Costa Rica, populates with cloned dinosaurs. Jurassic Park's computer programmer, Dennis Nedry, deactivates the park's security system to allow him access to the embryos storage room; he has been paid to steal the embryos and deliver them to a corporate rival. Many of the park's electric fences are deactivated as a result, releasing a T. Rex that attacks the tour group. On his way to deliver the embryos to the island's docks, Nedrylost, crashes his Jeep, and is killed by a Dilophosaurus.

Why I choose this film because I am interested in learning character of Dennis Nedry's work which can be extracted and analyzed as learning materials and experience of others.that I am going to analyze from this film is "The Ambition of Dennis Nedry to Ruin John Hammond's Business Ended in Tragedy in Jurassic Park by Michael Crichton".

E. Objectives of the Research

- 1. To analyze the characterization by using methods of characterization.
- 2. To analyze the plot and setting in this literary work.
- 3. To analyze literary works by using the concepts of the psychoanalytic theories of Ambition and Tragedy.
- 4. To reinforce theme by using the intrinsic and extrinsic approaches.

F. Framework of the Theories

Based on the above mentioned, in this research the writer uses the concepts of intrinsic and extrinsic approaches. For the intrinsic, the writer uses literary approaches. Meanwhile, for the extrinsic approach, the writer uses the psychoanalytic approach.

1. Indirect Method (Showing)

There are essentially two methods of indirect characterization by showing: characterization through dialogue (what characters say) and characterization through action (what characters do).²

a Characterization through dialogue.

The task of establishing character through dialogue is not a simple one. Some characters are carefully and guarded in what they say: they speak only by indirection, and what we must infer from their words what they actually mean. Others are open and candid; they tell us, or appear to tell us, exactly what is on their minds. Some characters are given to chronic exaggeration and overstatement; others to understatement and subtlety. It is a rare work of fiction, whose author does not employ dialogue in some way to reveal, establish, and reinforce character.³

b. Characterization through action.

To establish character on the basis of action, it is necessary to examine the several events of the plot for what they seem to reveal about the characters, about their unconscious emotional and psychological states as well as about their conscious attitudes and values.⁴

c. Setting

ELEMENTS SETTING AS A FICTION

Dealing with a work of fiction, in essence we are dealing with a world, in a possible world, a world that is equipped with occupant figures and issues. But, of course, it is not complete because the characters with a variety of life experiences that require a scope, place and time, as only a human life in the real world. ⁵

1. ELEMENTS OF SETTING

Elements Setting can be divided into three main elements, namely of place, time and social condition. The third element although each offers different issues and can talk about themselves.

a. Setting of Place

Background to suggest the location where the events recounted in a work of fiction. Element may be used where the places with certain names, certain initials, perhaps a particular location without a clear name.

b.Setting of time

Background related to the problem of time "when" the occurrence of the events described in a work of fiction. The issue of "when" is usually associated with a factual time, time that are related or can be attributed to historical events.

c. Setting of Social Condition

Social background suggests on matters related to the conduct of social life in a place that is told in a work of fiction.

2. Plot

Plot is the deliberately arranged sequence of interrelated events that constitute the basic narrative structure of a novel or a short story or film. The plot has five distinct sections as follows:

a. Exposition.

The exposition is the beginning section in which the author provides the necessary background information, sets the scene, establishes the situation, and dates the action. At this point, the author may also introduce the characters and the conflict, or the potential for conflict. The exposition may be accomplished in a single sentence or paragraph, or, in the case of some novels, occupy an entire chapter or more.⁶

b. Complication/Rising Action.

This section breaks the existing equilibrium and introduces the character and the underlying or inciting conflict. The conflict is then developed gradually and intensified.⁷

c. Crisis/Climax.

The crisis is the moment at which the plot reaches its point of greatest emotional intensity; it is the turning point of the plot, directly precipitating its resolution.⁸

d. Falling Action.

Once the crisis, or turning point, has been reached, the tension subsides and the plot moves toward its appointed conclusion.⁹

e. Resolution.

The final section of the plot is its resolution; it records the outcome of the conflict and establishes some new equilibrium or stability. The resolution is also referred as the conclusion. ¹⁰

1. Extrinsic Approach (The Psychoanalytic Approach)

Psychology is a field of science that studies the human behavior and cognition. According to the origin of the word, psychology comes from the Ancient Greek: " $\psi \nu \chi \dot{\eta}$ " (Psyche means soul) and " $-\lambda o \gamma \dot{\iota} \alpha$ " (-logia which means knowledge) so that in etymology, psychology can be interpreted as the study of the soul.¹¹

1) Ambition

A psychology of ambition is about realizing the two distinct types of forces or factors that make a person ambitious and should be focused on how these forces could be used effectively. These are however general reasons for which people become ambitious and we all seem to be motivated by quite a few of these reasons. In fact many people can identify with most of the reasons given here so there are several factors that seem to drive us towards achieving certain goals. We are ambitious because we want social status, and we are afraid of rejection or failure in our personal and professional life. Thus a man may become ambitious so that he can flaunt his position, rank or success to attract potential mates, a woman may become ambitious because she has deep feelings of inferiority and wants to favourable match up to other people showing extreme competitiveness. Jealousy is a negative force can be turned around positively as competitiveness and an individual jealous of a friend's achievement can strive to excel in his own way. Again feelings of inferiority or narcissism would be negative forces but can be used positively to tap the deeper ambitions that we all have. However ambition taken to delusional levels as we see in dictators shows how positive forces like motivation and
