CONCLUSION

The last part of the research is drawing a conclusion to get a brief explanation. This part contains a summary of what I researched. The conclusion of this research explains the individual and institutional discrimination that is experienced by black people in The Best of Enemies movie script. The conclusion also describes the process of black people to get victory in society.

From the result of the analysis done with intrinsic and extrinsic approaches in the movie script of *The Best of Enemies*, the researcher discovers several discriminations elaborated from each approach. The issue raised by this research is all connected to intrinsic features such as characterization, plot, setting, and theme. The extrinsic approach of sociology discriminations discussion is explained by the individual discrimination and institutional discrimination, which further emphasize its subtopic. Every data of discrimination can be seen in the movie script through utterances and narration.

The characters that are analyzed using dramatic methods are Ann Atwater and C.P Ellis. The main character of civil rights activist named Ann Atwater. She has a character that does not give up easily and is persistent. In contrast, C.P Ellis has a character that always underestimates the black people because he feels that his class is higher. The story's plot depicts the developing issues and events, with various plot such as exposition, complication, crisis, falling action, and resolution. The setting of the scene refers to the locale where events take place. The settings of the place are Klavern Hall, Ellis House, Hallway, City Hall, and East End Middle School. The setting of time specifies the exact time mentioned in the movie script, and the setting of atmosphere represents the situation and what the character feels in several events in the movie script.

The discrimination that happened in this movie script ends with conciliation by black people because at the charrette, the black people's team got more votes than the white people's team. Hence the school integration that Ann Atwater and black people fought for rights was successful during the black people's lives, they never got any rights in society. Since black people got their rights at that time, all policies and rules were changed black people could live peacefully without any discrimination from others, especially from white people.

I suggest that the discrimination happens in this movie script because the white people have behaviors that show they are superior to others, called the superiority complex. This condition is formed because of feelings about insecurity and self-confidence issues. The superior behavior shown is just a way to get away from that sentiment.

The writer hopes that the search can be useful for future research to analyze "The Best of Enemies" movie script using the same object with different methodological or similar concepts with different objects. This research is also expected to educate the English Language and Culture Department students about individual discrimination and institutional discrimination.
