#### **CHAPTER I**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

#### A. Background of the Research

Many literature works are created in this world. Every author creates different story each time. Some of them create it based on their life or people life in the environment. One of literature work is a novel. The exciting novel can makes the reader be curious with the whole of its story. There are many genre of novel. One of them is crime fiction. Margaret Yorke is one of crime fiction writer. I use her novel *Almost the Truth* as my research.

Margaret York was born in Surrey, living in Dublin until 1937 before moving to England. During the War, she worked in Woman's Royal Naval Service as a driver. Then she worked in Library of Oxford University. She became a first woman who ever worked in Christ Church's library. She also ever became a campaigner in Public Lending Rights to writers in England. She was appointed as a Chief of the Crime Writers' Association in 1979-1980. The other works of Yorke except *Almost the Truth*, such as *Dead in the Morning, The Point of Murder, Serious Intent and Act of Violent*. In 1982 she won Swedish Academy Detection's Award for the best of translation novel. She also won Golden Handcuffs as a crime writer who notable in the Nation. (Margaret Yorke, n.d)

Almost the Truth by Margaret Yorke tells about the girl who still nineteen years old named Hannah. She is a daughter of Derek and Janet. Her parents are divorced. She lives with her father when the robbery happens. The bravery of Hannah rises when she fights aback the robber. But Feeling scare and far away from the man happened because she gets raped by one of the robber outright as rapist too. Feeling hate also come to herself after the rapped. She tries a suicide attempt even though it fails. She loses her sexual desire when her boyfriends closes to her and wants to kiss and hug her.

She does not accept or care with her boyfriend when Pater becomes passionate. She pushes away his boyfriend. It is because she still remembers the bad incident at night. She is irresponsive to a man. She also feels ashamed to Peter and Tom. Other side, she feels not safe and worthless if she keeps living in her house. So she decides not to live in the Elms for awhile and moves to Scotland.

Then she lives near the Bird Conservation and work in there. She finds the place which makes her comfortable, safely, happy and also hopeful getting better life in there. But feeling frigid to man cannot clear casually. However Janet always worries about her daughter. Feeling hate and disappoint seems in Hannah towards her father, making her father fells guilty because he does not try to help her daughter from the rape. Until her father does revenge toward the rapist. He disguises as other people. He disguises as Vic Kempt with different appearance. Derek success to avenge but Hannah still cannot forgive her father totally.

In this research I will present psychological of woman who ever raped by the robbery. I will analyze Hannah as the main character and others character who can support this analysis. In this research, I use some elements. I use intrinsic and extrinsic approaches. For intrinsic approaches I use characterization, setting and plot. While extrinsic approaches I use psychology approaches-abnormal psychology. There are trauma and frigidity.

#### **B. Identification** of the Problem

I use the intrinsic elements and the concepts of trauma and frigidity. Hopefully I can prove by takes some steps as follows:

Based on the framework of the theories above, I use a variety of quantitative research method, type of literary research, interpretative/analysis research with the

method of data collection in the form of literary text form the novel titled *Almost The Truth* by Margaret Yorke as a primary source and supported by some literatures related to the theory/concepts/definition suitable as a secondary source.
